



Bruce Highway Upgrade – Anzac Avenue to Caboolture-Bribie Island Road

North Lakes to Caboolture

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) is planning for staged upgrades to the Bruce Highway from North Lakes to Caboolture.

Initial planning has identified the following concepts to improve transport safety, efficiency and reliability for all Queenslanders and improve flood immunity.

Bruce Highway from Anzac Avenue to Uhlmann Road:

An additional northbound and southbound lane on this section of highway in place of the existing median.

Bruce Highway from Uhlmann Road to Caboolture-Bribie Island Road:

Options are being investigated to either add an additional northbound and southbound lane; or add one-way, two-lane Collector Distributor (CD) roads on both sides of the existing Bruce Highway.

Active transport options are planned, with pedestrian and bike rider facilities planned on the western side of the highway between Anzac Avenue and Caboolture-Bribie Island Road along with improved east-west facilities to better connect communities

Planning for these upgrades is vital to improve traffic flow and safety while providing capacity to accommodate continued growth in one of the fastest growing regions in south-east Queensland.



Detailed Business Case

The Australian and Queensland governments have committed \$34 million to develop three Detailed Business Cases (DBC) for upgrades to the Bruce Highway between Anzac Avenue and Caboolture—Bribie Island Road:

Due to the interdependent nature of these two consecutive sections, the Uhlmann Road to Buchanan Road and the Buchanan Road to Caboolture-Bribie Island Road business cases will be completed as one planning study.

Bruce Highway Upgrade – Anzac Avenue to Uhlmann Road North Lakes to Burpengary

Initial planning has identified a concept for highway upgrades through the construction of additional traffic lanes in place of the existing median. This concept would utilise the existing median between the current northbound and southbound lanes to add an additional traffic lane in each direction of travel (increasing lanes from three to four in each direction).


Planning also includes:

- replacing the Frawley Avenue/Potassium Street and the Station Road/Arthur Drewett Drive overpasses
- active transport facilities connecting north to south, with multiple connections to local networks
- widening or replacing the Bruce Highway bridges over Burpengary Creek
- relocating the southbound Heavy Vehicle Interception Site.





The upgrades shown are indicative and are subject to change following community consultation and as planning progresses.



Bruce Highway Upgrade — Uhlmann Road to Caboolture-Bribie Island Road


Burpengary to Caboolture

Options are being investigated to either add an additional northbound and southbound lane; or add CD roads on both sides of the Bruce Highway. The CD roads option would see separate two-lane, one-way roadways on either side of the highway, connecting interchanges and replacing some on and off-ramps.

Widening into the median is challenging in this section because of the significant number of merges and lane changes that occur in this section, generated by the proximity of the Uhlmann Road interchange, Buchanan Road interchange, Caboolture-Bribie Island Road interchange and service centres. Separating shorter local trips from highway traffic reduces weaving associated with traffic entering and exiting the highway, allowing the highway to operate more efficiently.

Both options provide for improved travel times, traffic flow and safety for local traffic by delivering:

- upgrades to the existing Uhlmann Road, Buchanan Road and Caboolture-Bribie Island Road interchanges
- upgrades to the Bruce Highway bridges over the Caboolture River to improve flood immunity
- active transport facilities connecting north to south, with connections to local networks.



What are CD roads?

CD roads are built parallel and separate to a main carriageway—collecting local traffic and distributing it to the road network between interchanges. They enhance highway operation by providing extra road space and improve safety by reducing the need for vehicles to weave through highway traffic. For this project, CD roads are being considered on both sides of the Bruce Highway.


